Elements of Genius: Nikki Tesla and the Ferret-Proof Death Ray by Jess Keating - JF KEA

Nikki Tesla is a genius, so mostly she finds school boring, and amuses herself by inventing things. She and her ferret are hustled off to the special Genius Academy with classmates who are equally exceptional, although she still worries about fitting in.

A Royal Guide To Monster Slaying by Kelley Armstrong - JF ARM

Twelve-year-old Rowan, a reluctant heir to the throne, has her fate upended by a tragedy when she finds herself hunting the dangerous gryphon, accompanied by a feisty baby jackalope and a giant wolf that barely tolerates her.
