Bear Island by Matthew Cordell - P COR

Louise and her family are sad over the loss of their beloved dog, Charlie. "Life will not be the same," Louise says, as she visits a little island that Charlie loved. But on a visit to the island after Charlie's death, something strange happens: She meets a bear. At first, she's afraid, but soon she realizes that the bear is sad, too. As Louise visits more often, she realizes that getting over loss takes time.

Dance Like A Leaf by A.J. Irving - P IRV

As her grandmother's health declines, a young girl begins to take the lead in their cozy shared autumn traditions.

An Ordinary Day by Elana K. Arnold - P ARN

An ordinary day in an ordinary neighborhood turns out to be extraordinary in this story about new life, death, and family.

Paws + Edward by Espen Dekko - P DEK

Paws, an old, faithful dog, dreams about the rabbits he used to chase, while he spends his last moments with his devoted young boy, Edward.

Addy's Cup of Sugar by Jon J. Muth - P MUT

In this reworking of the Buddhist parable, Stillwater, a giant panda, teaches Addy that the grief she feels for the loss of her kitten, is part of life and is shared by everybody.

The End of Something Wonderful: a practical guide to a backyard funeral by Stephanie V.W. Lucianovic - P LUC

Describes how to prepare a funeral for a beloved pet, from choosing a box and backyard location to saying a few words and marking the spot.

The Funeral by Matt James - P JAM

Although Norma does not understand all the rituals that happen when she attends a funeral with her family, she does enjoy playing with her cousin and feels the deceased would have liked the funeral.

Always Remember by Cece Meng - P MEN

When Old Turtle dies and is taken back by the sea, his friends remember that he was a wonderful teacher and friend who made his world a better place.

When Aunt Mattie Got Her Wings by Petra Mathers - P MAT

When Aunt Mattie dies, best friends Lottie and Herbie console each other and celebrate Aunt Mattie's life by scattering her ashes and preparing her favorite snack--peanut butter and jelly sandwiches (with bananas).

Life Is Like The Wind by Shona Innes - P INN Introduces the concept of death to young readers by likening life to the ever-moving wind. When the wind is present, things move and fly and flutter about. When the wind goes away, things become very still. From there, the authors explore the feelings we have when a loved one's life goes away, how we cope with missing them, and how we can celebrate their memory.

Big Cat, Little Cat by Elisha Cooper - P COO

A moving tale about friendship, new beginnings, and cats

Glitter Gets Everywhere by Yvette Clark JF CLA

Relocating from London to New York City with her family in the aftermath of her mother's death, Kitty struggles to adjust to a different culture, before an unlikely friendship inspires alternate perspectives on how to keep her mother's memory alive.

All The Ways Home by Elsie Chapman - JF CHA

After his mother's death, Kaede develops some behavior problems and is sent to Japan to spend time with his estranged father and an older half brother.

Broken Strings by Eric Walters - JF WAL

In 2002, Shirli Berman loses her beloved grandmother and lands a part in her junior high production of "Fiddler on the Roof," but when she is doing research in her attic and finds a violin, her Zayde gets incredibly angry.

The Many Worlds of Albie Bright by Christopher Edge - JF EDG

When Albie's mother dies from cancer, his father explains that she may be alive in a parallel universe, so he decides to universe-hop and find her with the help of a banana, a laptop, and a box.

A newbie to the track team, Patina "Patty" Jones must learn to rely on her family and teammates as she tries to outrun her personal demons.
